

BURSWOOD PARK FORESHORE STAGE 1 EROSION CONTROL AND REVEGETATION - CONSTRUCTION

Planned construction works at Burswood Park foreshore to repair and stabilise eroded shoreline – summer 2018/19

This is a joint project between the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions Riverbank Program and Burswood Park Board.

STAGE 1

Burswood Park foreshore is currently experiencing significant erosion caused by wind generated waves and boat wake. As a result, a combination of stabilisation techniques are being constructed to dissipate wave energy, reducing erosion of the shoreline. These techniques aim to arrest erosion, repair sections, and stabilise the foreshore for years to come.

An outcome of the Stage 1 works will be to improve the amenity, appearance and ecology of the shoreline.

Burswood Park foreshore will be revegetated with native vegetation to help stabilise the foreshore, in addition to providing a vegetation corridor for native fauna and enhance the amenity of the park.

IMPACT ON PARK USERS

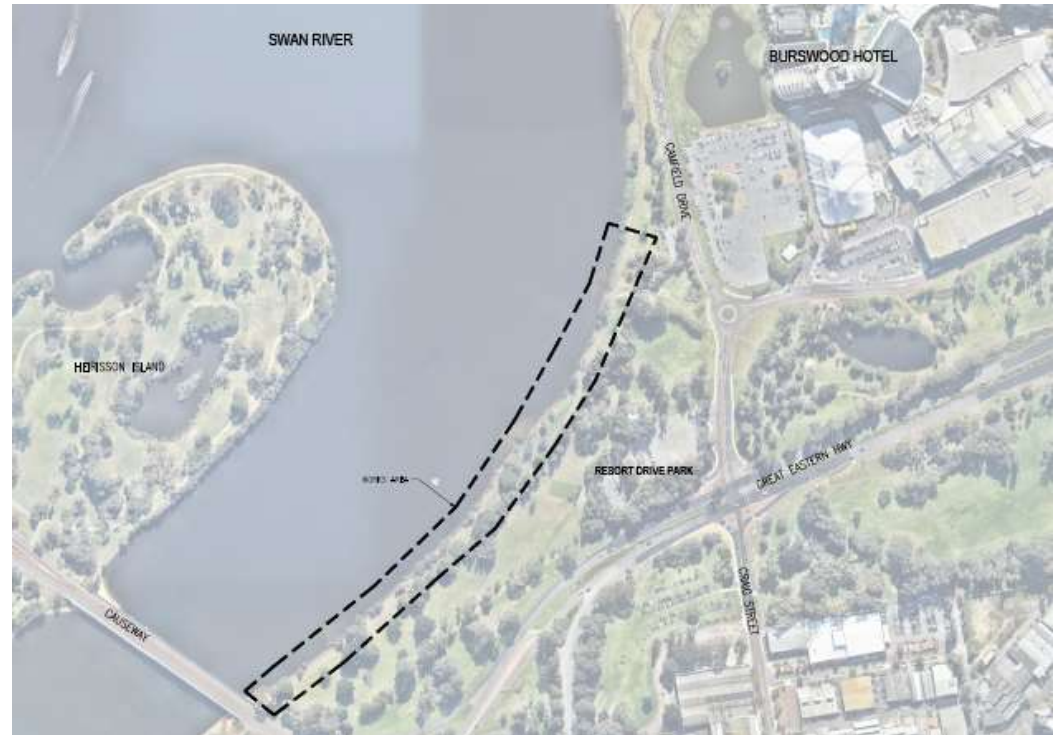
While the park will remain open to the public, sections of the foreshore will be closed during construction. Unfortunately, and in addition to this:

- Carols in the Park has been cancelled for 2018; and
- The dual use pathway will require sections to be closed and detours put in place – see Traffic Management signage for details.

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE

The construction works aim to commence in summer 2018 and the full works are due to be completed by early 2019. For additional details on construction refer to Traffic Management signage
